**INTRODUCTION:** During this quarter we will be introduced to the ministry of the Old Testament prophets. We will see how God appointed people from among Israel and Judah to speak for Him. The prophet would bring God's message of what He expected from His people. We will learn why prophets were necessary in the history of Israel. The term "Deuteronomy" means "Second Law". Israel can see the Promised Land as they stood in Moab, just across from the Jordan River. Moses was the only leader these people had known. Deuteronomy reflects on his role as leader and prophet as they left their old way of living and moved toward the new.

**SUMMARY:** The Book of Deuteronomy covers the final chapter of Israel's forty-year wilderness journey. The final Book in the Pentateuch, which means 'five books', is also known as the Torah. The Exodus from Egypt to the Promised Land, from slavery and wilderness wondering to the land flowing with milk and honey was the most significant event in Israel's history. God called Moses to speak on His behalf [Exodus 3 – 4]. When they were on the edge of Canaan, Moses gave several messages of how they were to live when they arrived in the Promised Land. If they had only obeyed Moses and the prophets God sent, they would have been prosperous in the new land.
