## Justified by Faith

Romans 3:21-30
Devotional Reading: John 3:1-8, 13-17
Background Scripture: Romans 3:21-30

LESSON AIMS: the students will:

- Identify what is "excluded" and why
- Explain the concept of propitiation
- Brainstorm ways to explain the concept of propitiation to an unbeliever

INTRODUCTION: Paul wrote this letter to the church at Rome around AD 57, about 25 years after Stephen's stoning. He wanted his readers to understand the gravity of their sin and the depth of God's love. Paul had made the argument that all stand condemned before a holy and righteous God. No one has an excuse because God made the truth of a Creator available to all of mankind. He reminds the church at Rome - - and us - that obedience and good works do not make us righteous before God. Only by faith in the Lord Jesus Christ are we saved and made righteous before God. Everyone is a sinner and needs to be justified freely by God's grace through redemption in Jesus Christ.

KEY VERSE ${ }^{22}$ Even the righteousness of God which is by faith of Jesus Christ unto all and upon all them that believe: for there is no difference: ${ }^{23}$ For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God; ${ }^{24}$ Being justified freely by his grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus: Romans 3:22-24 / KJV
