LESSON AIMS: the students will:

- Identify what Christians have through faith
- Compare and contrast reconciliation with God to reconciliation between people
- Commit to sharing with an unbeliever a personal story of what life was like before and after being reconciled to God

INTRODUCTION: In Roman culture, the highest idea of friendship was the willingness to die for a friend. Paul shows God's profound love for His enemies. Evidently, Paul knew the challenges Christians were facing there. While he used this letter to introduce himself to the church in Rome, it was, more importantly, his opportunity to present the Gospel to them. Paul faced the challenge of convincing his Jewish brothers and sisters that salvation does not come from obeying the Law. It comes through having faith in Jesus Christ.

KEY VERSE 5 Therefore being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ:
